The CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Award seeks to promote Christian values of care and solidarity among participating young people by involving them, under the direction of CREIDEAMH Network volunteers in planning and undertaking activities that contribute to their own consciousness and the consciousness of others regarding the well-being of other human beings. In the process the Award scheme will also endeavour to empower them with new skills and abilities and give them an experience of working in partnership with adults who give expression to their faith through charitable outreach, social justice and /or evangelization-catechetical initiatives

We appreciate that the safety of your child is paramount, and to this effect all activities will be carried out in accordance with the Safeguarding Children Policy and Standards for the Catholic Church in Ireland, the diocesan Safeguarding Policy & Procedures of participating students, including Codes of Behaviour for Adults and Code of Behaviour with Children.

When a young person participates with us, the activity in which they are engaged must be chosen from the list pre-approved by the CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Awards Oversight Committee, all of which have an identified and agreed leader that is identified on our web page: www.creideamh.ie/ty

The following protocols also apply to those who wish to undertake this Award:

- 1. Parental/guardian consent is a requirement for all those participating in the Award who are under 18 years.
- Both the completed Application & Consent Form must be submitted to the CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Award's Oversight Committee's Secretary (see <u>www.creideamh.ie/ty</u> for details) and approved prior to engagement in the Award.
- 3. The CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Award's Oversight Committee will ensure, in consultation with personnel in the schools of participating students, that there is adequate supervision and a safe environment for participants to carry out their chosen activities through school (if appropriate).
- 4. The CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Award's Oversight Committee will ensure, in consultation with personnel in the schools of participating students, that there is adequate supervision and a safe environment for participants to carry out their chosen activities through parish (if appropriate).
- 5. Specific activities may require additional parental/guardian consent at the discretion of either, the CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Awards Oversight Committee or Chosen Activity Leader or both. In such cases parents/guardians will be contacted directly.

- 6. Where possible, it is highly recommended that participants of the Award carry out their chosen and pre-approved activity/ies in groups of four or more.
- 7. All Award participants who have a role in working directly with children or vulnerable adults (not applicable in 2020/2021) must complete the safeguarding awareness programme. In addition, all participants working with children or vulnerable adults who meet the requirements for vetting in their jurisdiction MUST be vetted. Activity leaders, in consultation with the CREIDEAMH Awards Oversight Committee will determine which participants need to be vetted.
- 8. Participants must act in accordance with the diocesan Safeguarding Policy & Procedures, including the Codes of Behaviour for Adults and Code of Behaviour with Children.
- 9. Activity Leaders / Mentors who have direct (person to person) and unsupervised contact with participants must be vetted and work in accordance with the Codes of Behaviour for Adults and Code of Behaviour with Children. Activity Leaders / Mentors never have one-to-one direct contact with individual Award participants.
- 10. Photographs may be taken of participants with their consent during Award activities/trips to help promote the Award or Humanitarian issue being addressed. Photographs **MUST NOT** be posted on social media websites without the prior consent of the participant, parent and leader.
- 11. Participants may be asked to provide an email and mobile phone number for communication. These details will only be used by the leaders for Award related activities. Texts and emails may be used to promote Award events. If you are unhappy with this please inform the Activity Leader / Mentor and / or CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Awards Oversight Committee.
- 12. Participants medical conditions or dietary requirements are the responsibility of the parent/guardian. Please make the Activity Leader aware of any medical conditions, special needs or dietary requirements your child may have. Please Note: Award Leaders / Mentors cannot administer any medication.
- 13. By signing this CREIDEAMH Humanitarian Award Application & Consent Form, the parent/guardian is taking responsibility for the safety and well-being of the participant during activities that take place outside the scope of the participant's diocesan Safeguarding Policy & Procedures and outside school hours.
