What is a 'Young Pioneer'?

A Young Pioneer is a person between the ages of 11 and 18 who pledges:

- To abstain from alcohol until their 18th birthday
- 2. To abstain from harmful drugs for life
- Who is willing to offer their abstinence as a spiritual sacrifice for the recovery of problem drinkers and victims of substance abuse.

S/he also commits to praying daily for people who suffer owing to addiction, and to wearing the Young Pioneer emblem as a sign of their care for all who battle addiction.

Young Pioneer Daily Prayer

Lord, for your sake, for the recovery of problem drinkers and victims of substance abuse, to make amends to your Sacred Heart for the intemperance in all our lives,
I promise not to take alcoholic drink until I am at least 18, and to keep off drugs for life. Amen.
